Christmas in Italy

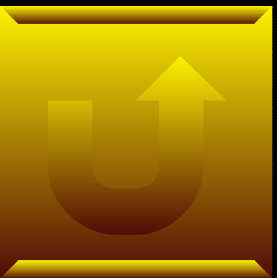


Christmas in Italy is a religious festival.

“PANETTONE” and “PANDORO”.

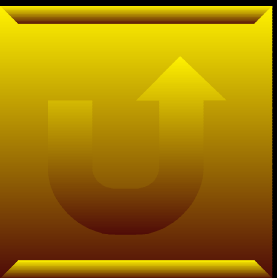
At Christmas, people exchange presents with their relatives and their parents.
